Figure 10.10 The relationship between the number of hours of sleep and the number of hours of work for a sample of 100 employees

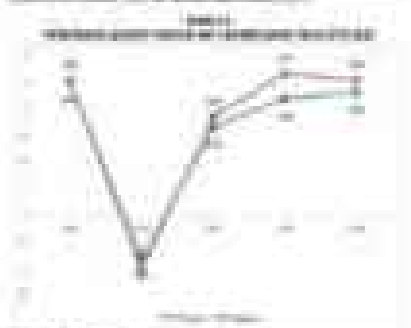
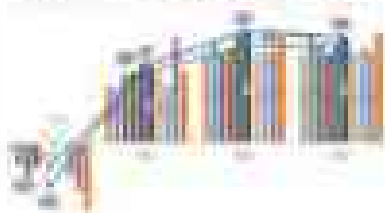


Figure 10.11 The relationship between the number of hours of sleep and the number of hours of work for a sample of 100 employees

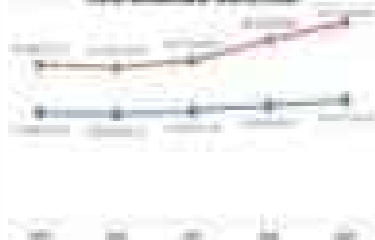

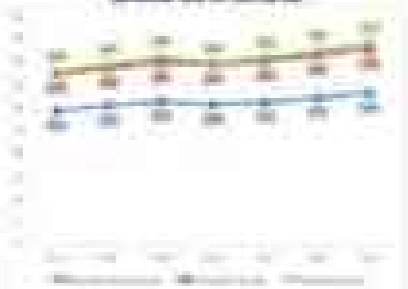

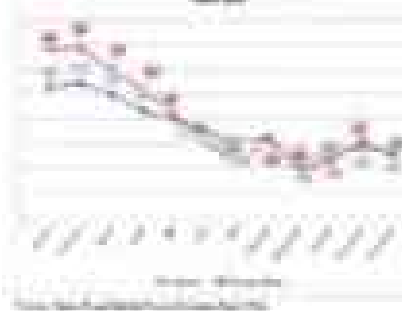

 The number of people who have been vaccinated against COVID-19 in the United States, by state, as of March 2021

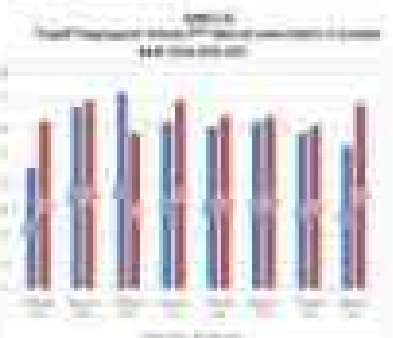

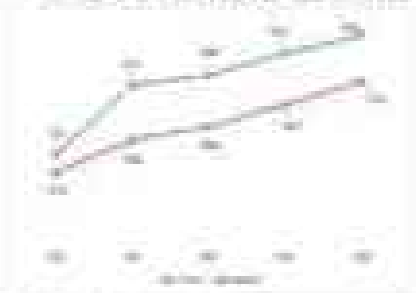

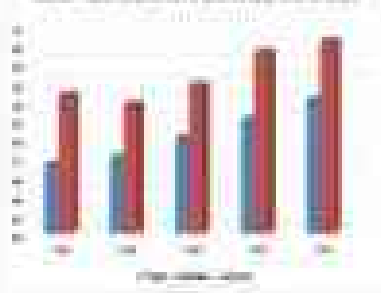

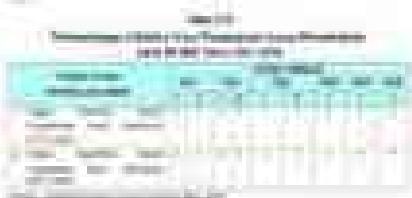

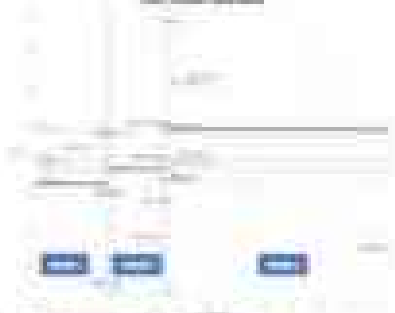

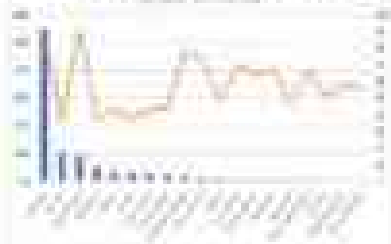


Figure 1. Employment rates by sex and age group, 1990-2010

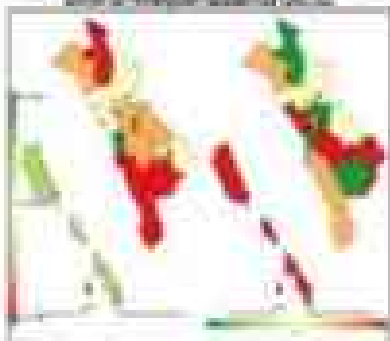


Figure 11.1: Two birds perched on a branch.
